

Grosse Pointe Hunt Club Summer Camp 2010

Welcome to the Grosse Pointe Hunt Club. We're sure your child will enjoy their week and will make many friends. In order to make the most of the week, there are some important things you and your child should know.

Our camp has three main areas of activities: Barn – Tennis – Swimming.

Generally, the average daily group size can range from 30-40 campers. With this in mind – the large group is divided into 2 or more smaller groups to travel to certain areas. When one group is in an activity, the other group will be enjoying a planned outdoor activity (basketball, kickball, free time on playscape, and/or crafts)

Barn: 45 mins each group (total time 90 mins - if large group is split into smaller groups then each group will get equal time) Tuesday – Friday every week (except for the week of the Annual Horse Show in August.)

In the Barn, your camper will be introduced (if this is their first exposure) to sights, sounds and smells that can sometimes be overwhelming. For those who have been around a barn before it may not seem to be a bother. Some of the activities in the barn are: pony rides, grooming, tacking, bathing, feeding. For safety reasons for the horse, rider & walker – when temperatures reach 90 degrees or higher, any type of riding is cancelled.

Tennis: 30 mins each group (total time 1 hour) – Monday - Thursday

Each group will be introduced to the game. The Tennis pros use a quick start tennis approach which promotes hand-eye coordination & basic racquet skills. The camper will also be able to learn basic strokes, scoring & rules of the game.

Swim: 1 hour

The camper will be swimming at the end of the day, weather permitting. The time in the pool is for the kids to cool off and enjoy themselves.

If you are looking for more specialized training or lessons in any of these areas, information is available for private riding, tennis and swim. Please inquire at 313/884-9090 ext 100.
